




As usual, just looking at him gave me confidence. I gripped my sword tightly and turned back to watch my ghost. And found it right there beside the chains. Soundless, swift as thinking, it had darted in as soon as I'd looked away. I swung the rapier up.

I was given the impression that the two characters are quite calm and confident, despite there being two ghosts arriving. I know the pair are calm because it says, "I turned my back on its position," which tells me that the character didn't mind not being able to see a ghost and trusted his partner. Also, the text states, "It had been with us for almost five minutes," meaning they are not scared or worried in the presence of the ghost.

(3 marks)

The characters give the impression that they are in control and know what they are doing. The text states that they have now been working as a ghost hunter fir 12 months now and that hardly anything bothered them. One of the characters says "Oh, that's brilliant," which sounds like he is making a joke in the unusual situation.

(3 marks)

I get the impression that the characters are not scared. I think this because in the text, the character talks about how he isn't scared of ghosts with broken necks or worse.

(2 marks)

The ghost hunters were very calm and not worried because they were used to dealing with all sorts of ghosts or visitors.

(2 marks)

The characters were calm and not scared by the ghosts.

(1 marks)

I thought that they were confident because they knew how to catch the ghosts.

(I marks)

I think Lockwood is experienced because it talks about previous jobs where he was flustered, but only because his jacket hat been torn, not because of the ghosts. (2 marks)

Lockwood is assured and confident that he can deal with the situation.
