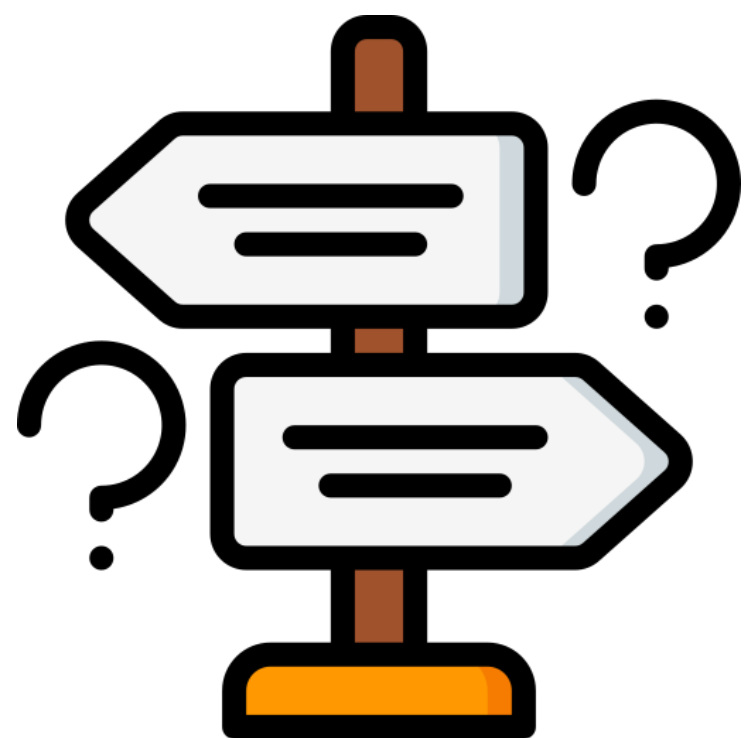
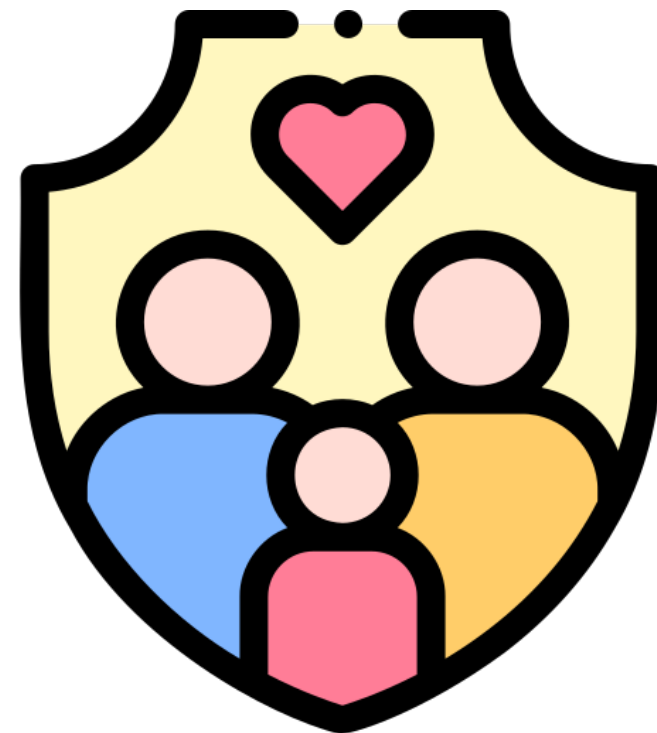
Display Slips
