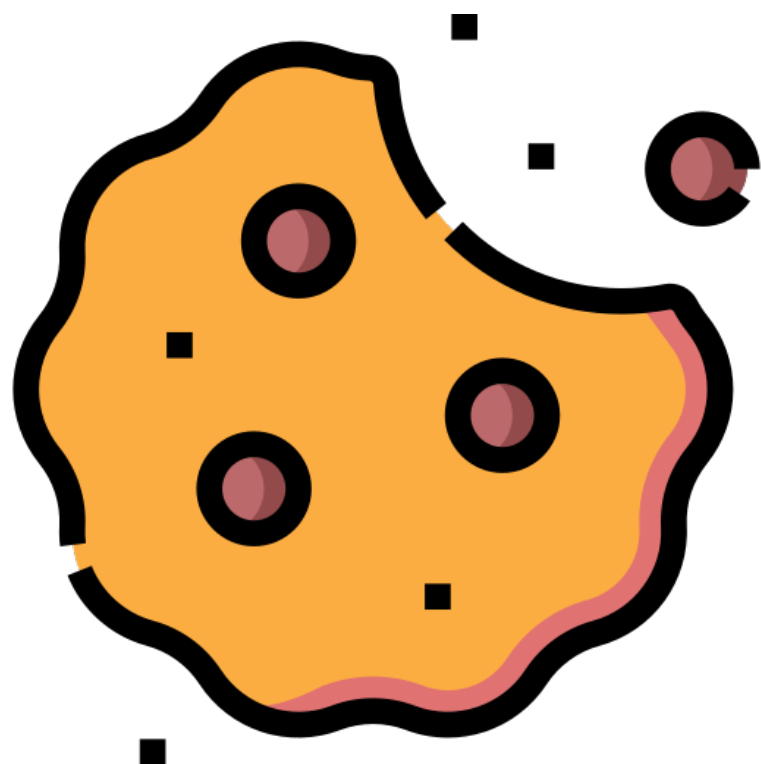
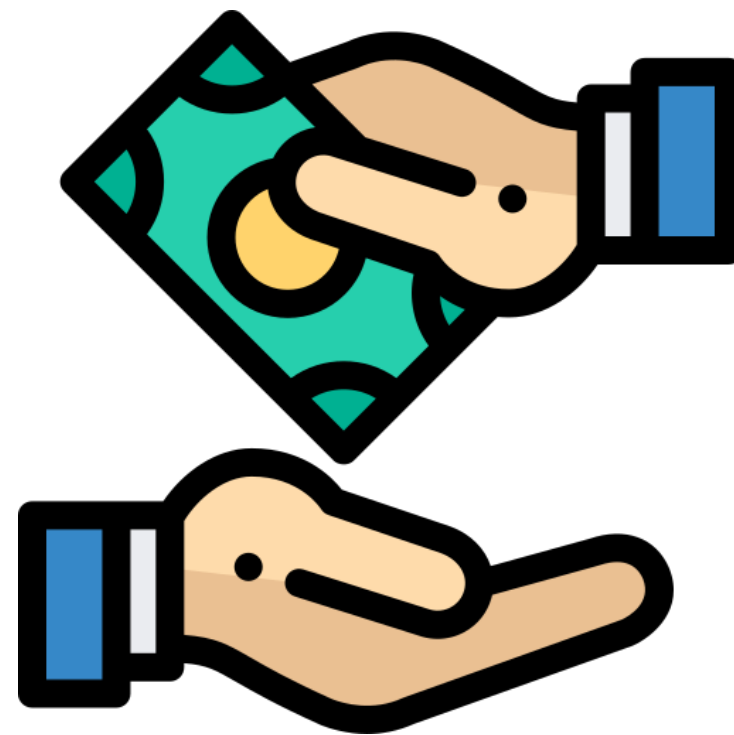
Display Slips

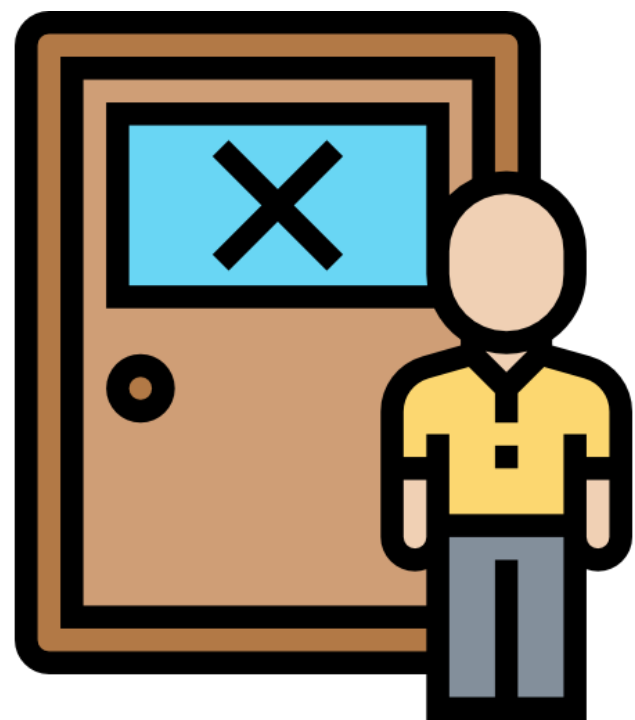
